SURVEY METHODOLOGY

The 2023 MBA Alumni Insights Survey was sent out on 12 October 2023 to 7,650 of AIB's subscribed global MBA alumni who graduated between 2005 and 2023.

Respondents were asked to answer 31 questions about their career experience, MBA outcomes and reflections on their studies. We received a total of 648 complete responses by the close of survey on 5 November 2023.

This survey sample represents 8.47% of our subscribed AIB MBA alumni population that graduated between 2005 and 2023.












